The Yellow Suffrage Rose

IFRW members have asked, "What does the yellow rose in the IFRW Logo symbolize?" The yellow rose stands for women's suffrage,

In 1920, suffragists and anti-suffragists met in Nashville, Tennessee to lobby the state legislature for and against ratifying the 19th Amendment, which would give women the right to vote.

Lobbying on both sides was intense – Tennessee would either be the needed 36th state to ratify the amendment for it to become law or to reject ratification and ensure the fight continued.



Both sides wore rose-shaped pins to indicate which side of the battle they were on. Supporters of suffrage wore yellow roses in public. Those opposed to suffrage wore red.

YOU CAN BE A DELEGATE TO THE REPUBLICAN CONVENTION

WHAT IS THE REPUBICAN STATE CONVENTION?

It's a place for Republicans who vote in the Republican Primary election or affiliate with the Republican Party to define our shared beliefs and to determine how we will promote them. Republicans do this by: 1) creating a "Party Platform" 2) setting rules and 3) electing people to run the Party between State Conventions.

WHO CAN ATTEND THE REPUBLICAN STATE CONVENTION?

Anyone who is affiliated with the Republican Party by voting in the Party Primary or by becoming a delegate to the Convention.

WHAT IS A DELEGATE?

Delegates are grassroots Republicans who participate in shaping the Republican Party and determining the Party's role and direction regarding public policy. Delegates volunteer and are chosen by the Republican County Chairs to attend the Republican State Convention in even-numbered years.

STEP 1—COUNTY CONVENTION

County Conventions will be held on April 17, 2024. Each County Party sets the location and time. Only elected precinct committeemen vote at the County Convention. They elect the Delegates to the State Convention. In the days/weeks before the County Convention, visit committee meetings and let them know what issues are important to you.

STEP 2—STATE CONVENTION

The State Convention will be held in Collinsville, Illinois from May 24-25th. Committees will meet May 24th. General Session will meet May 25th. Please check www.il.gop for Convention details. Attendees will be able to speak before committees about issues they care about, vote on the Party Platform that will state the beliefs of the Party, vote on the rules that will steer the Illinois Republican Party, and elect people to lead the Republican Party for the next two years.

WHY BECOME A ILLINOIS REPUBLICAN PARTY DELEGATE?

Because **YOU** will have a role in shaping the beliefs and direction of the Illinois Republican Party and determining public policy implementation.

REMEMBER:

Group pictures are fine, but not all the time. Mix it up with both large and small group pictures. Action pictures are best! When two or more members take photos, someone is apt to 'capture that special moment'.

LEGISLATIVE/TAKING ACTION

WITNESS SLIPS

WHAT IS A WITNESS SLIP?

An Illinois House or Senate Bill must pass through a Committee to advance on to the General Assembly for a vote. Hearings are called while the bill is in Committee. This is when a witness slip comes into play.

A witness slip is a person's or group's position on a particular bill that can be filed on behalf of that person or an organization they are representing. Because witness slips can influence the outcome of a committee vote, that is why it is important to file them.

IMPORTANT!

Please note that alerts are sent out to file witness slips as soon as the hearing is called for a bill. When you receive an alert, please fill out the witness slip as soon as possible. We cannot control how many days that are given to fill out the slips. The window to do so is at times very short. We apologize if you have attempted to fill out a witness slip, and it was too late. We try our best to get them out as fast as we can.

Here is the status of the bills that we are watching.

HB4876: Abortion/gender affirming care This bill amends the Abused Neglected Child Reporting Act to redefine "abused child" as it relates to abortion, medical care, gender confirming services. This bill has been referred to committee.

HB2401: Amends the School Code mandating books by diverse authors..... This bill has been assigned to Elementary and Secondary Education School Curriculum and Policies committee.

HB4133: Mandates bullying prevention programs in non-public, sectarian Schools. This bill has been assigned to the Elementary and Secondary Education School Curriculum and Policies committee.
